Budj Bim Cultural Landscape is one of the worlds most extensive and oldest aquaculture systems

World Heritage journey



- **1989** – World Heritage inscription was first proposed for the Tae Rak (Lake Condah) area
- **2002** – Lake Condah Sustainable Development Plan identified World Heritage Listing as an objective
- **2002-2015** – Relevant research & lobbying
- **2017** - Budj Bim listed on Australian World Heritage Tentative List
- **2019** – Budj Bim Cultural Landscape inscribed on World Heritage List.






